

She was very active in the Belgrade Christian Assembly, she loved leading Bible studies and Senior Saints every month, and making a special "favor" for everyone. In 2010 she moved to Baker, MT to live near Sue where she led the Keenagers Luncheon at Baker Assembly of God. Katy loved spending time with her kids and grandkids.
